About the Annual Priorities for Communications

This year we're trying something different with communication priorities. We need feedback from CDCI staff and from you.

At the beginning of the month, we shared 6 possible communication priorities with CDCI staff. We asked them to choose their top two.

The potential priorities are:

- Community panels of self-advocates and their family members, who come together to discuss issues facing the disability community in Vermont
- More information on the CDCI's Accessibility website
- A CDCI Accessible Events guide
- Expanding CDCI's social media presence
- A CDCI accessibility blog
- Website traffic reports for CDCI projects

Each staff member could vote for two priorities total. The CDCI staff voted, and told us:

- A majority want community panels and an expanded CDCI Accessibility website
- Nearly half identified the Accessible Events guide as a priority
- Less than 10% want to expand CDCI's social media presence
- And less than 5% want website traffic reports for CDCI projects or a CDCI accessibility blog
