### 12:45 – 1:15 CDCI Recent Events and Updates (JESSE)

There have been many activities and events at the Center since our last meeting. CAC members have asked to be better informed. So, Jesse will share updates. Members should ask questions to learn more.

• We celebrated CDCI's 50th Anniversary on November 14.

- The <u>Inclusive Arts Vermont CYCLES Art Exhibition</u> has been on display at CDCI offices since early November.
  - o The exhibition is also available online as an audio tour.
  - Learn about the artists and listen to descriptions of their artwork.
  - Some artists will continue showing their work at CDCI through May.
- Think College gets international recognition:
  - Think College was featured at the <u>Inclusion in Action Conference</u> at University College Cork in Ireland!
  - Earned a spot on the <u>Zero Project</u> Shortlist for 2025. The shortlist means Think College was in the final round for an award for inclusive employment. Think College did not get an award but invited to March conference in Vienna, Austria.
- Vermont I-Team held the first session of their new <u>Inclusive School</u>
   <u>Conference series.</u> <u>Dr. Shelley Moore</u> led a dynamic session challenging educators to make schools fully inclusive.
- UVM purchased a license to watch the new documentary "The Ride
   Ahead" by Dan and Samuel Habib. You can use your UVM NetID to watch.
- UVM announced a new Office of Accessibility Services starting in January. This office will coordinate all student and employee disability services. Jesse met with the director to discuss how to support them.
